

## Sunset Cityscape

Materials: Large white paper, paper plate, tempera or acrylic paint in red, yellow, and white, paint brush, black construction paper, white and yellow crayons, scissors, and glue

## Directions:

1. On your paper plate, pour out small puddles of red, yellow, and white paint.

## Do you know what color red and yellow make when mixed together?

- 2. Begin to mix by dipping your brush in the red paint and bringing it over into the yellow puddle. Keep bringing red into the yellow, one dip at a time, until your puddle begins to turn orange. Now you have made orange!
- 3. Paint some of the orange onto your white paper.
- 4. Explore what happens when you mix white into the orange. Into the red? Mix more red into your orange. Add more yellow.
- 5. Continue to paint your paper using the variety of colors you made, making sure to touch every edge and corner until your paper is fully covered.

## Have fun, get messy, every sky is unique!

- 6. Set your sunset aside to dry.
- 7. On black construction paper, draw buildings using geometric shapes- squares, rectangles, triangles, and circles. Make many different buildings, tall and short, wide and skinny, anything you can think of!
- 7. Use your white and yellow crayons to draw windows on your buildings.
- 8. Cut out all of your buildings and glue them onto your sunset along the bottom of the paper.
- 9. Feel free to add a sun, clouds, birds, or anything to make it your own!
